SYMPOSIUM DESCRIPTION

Course description

This course aims to summarize and update the current knowledge and understanding of recent trends in ART. By focussing on patient friendly approaches to ART, the course should help participants to counsel infertile couples about the health aspects of infertility treatment. Furthermore, the course aims to present knowledge that can be translated into daily practice by identifying patients suitable for natural cycles, minimal stimulation and SET. The topics cover:

- Mild stimulation for ART
- Natural cycles
- In vitro maturation and vitrification: ready for use?
- Optimising the outcomes of mild stimulation
- How to do natural IVF/ICSI ?

The Saturday workshop on natural cycles, modified natural cycles and IVM will be organized by experienced groups coming from three university-based IVF centres in Maribor (SLO), Ljubljana (SLO) and Zagreb (CRO).

Course objectives

At the conclusion of this course, the participants should be able to:

- Critically evaluate the value of new methods
- Counsel patients about the results of oocyte retrieval in natural cycles
- Evaluate the outcomes of IVF treatment after mild stimulation
- Evaluate the value of IVM
- Understand current practice and policies of elective single embryo transfer
- Counsel patients for natural cycles, minimal stimulation and single embryo transfer

Medics: All medical professions working with IVF patients, from ART professionals to endocrinologists, epidemiologists, paediatricians, obstetricians, primary care providers and those in training. Non-medics: Reproductive nurses, psychologists, and embryologists
